Ingredients: 2 tsp. butter 1 onion 2 bags frozen perogis (28 total) 1 can cream soup (mushroom, chicken, etc.) 1/2 cup chopped ham, bacon or sausage 1/2 cup shredded cheese 3/4 cup milk

- 1. Preheat oven to 350. Grease 13 by 9 pan.
- 2. Saute onions in butter.
- 3. Combine soup and milk, set aside.
- 4. Spread perogis in bottom of pan.
- 5. Cover with onions and meat.
- 6. Pour soup mixture over top.
- 7. Cover with cheese.
- 8. Bake for one hour.

YARD WASTE: Includes brush, leaves, small tree stumps, logs and wood pieces under 6 feet long. Brush must be cut down, no full size tree limbs.

SCRAP METAL: Includes metal furniture, lawn chairs, lawn mowers without fluids, washers, dryers and household junk that is primarily metal.

RESIDENTIAL WASTE: Includes non-metal appliances, furniture, repair and remodeling scraps, old rugs and carpeting.

UNACCEPTABLE FOR DISPOSAL


Our school's Climate Action Team has initiated a Virtu-

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
